

Student Conduct Board at LUNEX

1. Purpose

The purpose of the Student Conduct Board is to:

1. Review and adjudicate alleged violations of the institution's student conduct policies.
2. Ensure fair, consistent, and impartial disciplinary procedures.
3. Promote a safe and respectful environment.
4. Promote the importance of ethical behavior.

2. Scope

The Student Conduct Board shall have jurisdiction over all students enrolled at LUNEX and shall hear cases involving alleged violations of the institution's Student Code of Conduct.

3. Authority

The Student Conduct Board has the authority to:

1. Conduct hearings related to student disciplinary matters.
2. Determine responsibility for alleged conduct violations.
3. Recommend appropriate sanctions in accordance with institutional policies.
4. Ensure due process is provided to all students.

4. Composition

The composition of the Student Conduct Board is initiated whenever a breach of the student conduct policy occurs, as well as upon by a student's request for an administrative hearing procedure submitted to the Student Support Officer.

Any LUNEX staff member that becomes aware of a breach of the student conduct policy or, in case of a student request, the Student Support Officer, will request the Chair of the Examination Board to appoint a Chair for the Student Conduct Board. The appointed Chair will then constitute the board.

The Student Conduct Board shall consist of the following members:

1. **Chairperson** – A staff member responsible for facilitating hearings and ensuring procedural compliance designated by Examination Board
2. **Student representatives** – 2 students appointed by LSU, upon request of the Chair
3. **Academic representatives** – 2 academic staff members
4. **Administrative representative** – 1 member from the Student Experience Office

5. Members eligibility

1. Student representatives must be in good academic and disciplinary standing.
2. Academic staff members should be appointed from a different study programme than the programme the student comes from.

6. Review and evaluation

The Constitution will be reviewed every three years.
